# ATTENDANCE NEWS

The Attendance and Pupil Welfare Service works with schools, parents and carers, pupils and other agencies to reduce unnecessary absences from school. The Education Welfare Officer, Mrs Vaughan, who attended the parents' coffee morning and parents' evening, will be in school for half a day every week. Mrs Vaughan will be working with pupils and parents to support them with attendance difficulties. She will also be working with groups of children to help them understand the importance of regular attendance. #### Termly Attendance Prize

At the Parent coffee morning, some parents raised the guestion about whether a prize could be given termly for children who have 100% attendance for a term. Although we do have the pizza hut trip for 100% attendance over the year, we agree that achieving 100% attendance for a term should also be celebrated. We are therefore introducing a new attendance prize for if a child has 100% attendance each term. During the first week of a new term, any children with 100% from the previous term will have a non uniform day, and will receive a prize in the afternoon. This prize may take different forms on a termly basis to keep the children motivated to achieve this prize. Ideas might be that they have a celebration/Disco together with party food and games, games time where they can bring in games from home to play or a DVD and popcorn session in the hall together. We will be discussing ideas at the parent ambassador meeting on the 15th February, so feel free to pass any suggestions onto your class parent ambassadors. As we are almost through the first half of the spring term; for next half term only, we will awarding the 100% attendance prize to any child with 100% attendance from after half term to the Easter holiday. 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## RECEPTION PARENT WRITING WORKSHOP

Did you know that writing is the weakest area nationally for reception children? This is a real focus for the children, not just in our school, but across all schools nationally. In order to support the children to achieve expected levels in writing, it is vital that they are supported from home. Mrs Robinson will be holding a workshop in class to give advice and guidance on what is expected for reception children at the end of the year, and how to support your child to achieve this. There will also be resources available to support your child at home, and a chance to look at your child's literacy books, and ask any questions about writing in EYFS. Reception parents are invited to attend this workshop on Friday 1st March at 2.45pm. Refreshments will be provided.

## **Y1 PHONICS SCREENING WORKSHOP**

All children in Y1 nationally will sit the phonics screening check. This is a reading test which tests their phonics skills. Our phonics screening results have always been, at least, in line with National figures and we hope to maintain this trend. We are holding a parent workshop on phonics screening showing what this will look like for the Y1 children, and also giving practical advice and support for parents to support their children at home further. Throughout this term, we will be completing a mock phonics test to give us a clear indication on where our children are currently, and whether they are on track to pass this. We ask that all Y1 parents please attend this workshop in order to gain further understanding. However, if we feel your child is 'at risk' of not passing then we will send a letter out to individual parents to ask them to attend. This will be held on March 22nd at 2.45pm. Refreshments will be provided

Although it is Y1 children who take the phonics screening test, the workshop is also open to Reception parents who wish to know more about the expectations on their children next year.

Based on feedback from the Autumn parents questionnaire and from discussions with children, we will not be investing in Bug Club for Key Stage 2 (Y3-Y6 pupils). Bug Club **will** still be purchased for Reception and Key Stage 1 (Y1+2).

The grammar section of Bug Club was also not being used effectively, so we will look for other resources to invest in to support the children. KS2 Bug Club and the Grammar Section will both be unavailable from 6<sup>th</sup> February.

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
